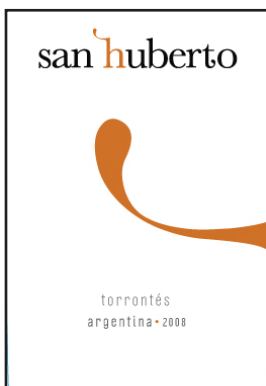

The making of a good wine is a task which involves many different and important aspects: know-how, time, perseverance and a little help from mother nature among only a few of them. But there is only one main factor in the whole history of wine and it is its origin. The location of the vineyards tells how that wine is and will be in the future. In the Valley de Aminga, province of La Rioja, there is a naturally privileged place in the middle of the desert for the development of high range products. Sandy and deep soil, dry climate, scarce rains, hot summers and very cold winters provides the ideal eco-system for a high quality wine at 1,450 meters above sea level.



Torrontes

This pale, straw colored white features powerful floral aromas on the nose—orange blossom in particular. It also shows some fennel, mineral and lemon aromas. The palate is crisp and light, with apple, lemon and flint. It has a subtle spice to it and has a little petrol on the finish, too.

Offers good aromatic intensity, fruity with hints of cherry, and notes of black pepper well-balanced with the notes of wood, vanilla and coffee. Noticeably fruity and spicy, in harmony with vanilla and coffee well-balanced with good structure, sweet tannins and a balanced finish.



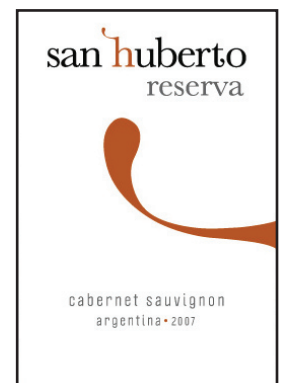
Merlot Reserva



Malbec Reserva

Offers intense nose of red fruits, plum, cherry, with a touch of coffee, chocolate and vanilla. The mouthfeel is smooth, pleasant, with soft tannins and plum and cherry flavors, mixing and mingling with the delicate flavor of the french oak.

Delivers intense red fruit aromas, cherry, marmalades, and mature pepper with hints of coffee and vanilla. Well structured in the mouth with sweet tannins and mature pepper flavors. Very fruity with notes of mature plums and cherry marmalade.



Cabernet Sauvignon Reserva
