



In 1979, the hundred year-old wine-making company, Miguel Torres, acquired a small winery in Curicó, in the Chilean central valley, as the first foreign company to back Chilean vineyard production located in a unique magical landscape, at the feet of the Andes volcanoes. Today, after almost thirty years, those 100 hectares acquired then have turned into 445 hectares of vineyards owned by the company itself. The first estates in these lands were Maquehua, San Francisco Norte and Cordillera. At the end of the 90s, San Luis de Alico and Empedrado were added.

What attracted the Torres family to winemaking in Chile were the excellent climatic conditions in which to grow vines. Chile has well differentiated seasons with spectacular temperature shifts, greater even than 20°C. Also the absence of Phylloxera means that it is not necessary to graft vines onto American rootstock. Finally the oldest viticultural traditions on the American continent. Spanish missionaries planted the first vineyards.

Later, in the 19th century they were re-planted with French varieties.

Santa Digna Range

The name Santa Digna was given to the crosses marking the district boundaries of a land. These crosses served to delimit territories and symbolised good fortune and protection for those who were leaving for other climes.
